Welcome and Introductions, Approval of Agenda and CAC Minutes from January 2020.

Ted Figura, Chair, started the meeting with a round of introductions. *All approved the previous meetings minutes.*

Ongoing MPO Efforts

Nick Kroncke briefed the group on efforts regarding the MTP, prioritization process which experienced delays and recent call for local government projects. Other initiatives the staff were working on are the Hellbender Regional Trail which is open for public comment and regional transit efforts in addition to administering special studies.

MTP Virtual Engagement and Workshop

Nick gave an overview of the MTP 2045, the MPOs long-range plan, and talked to the group about the different components of the plan. The next step was holding a virtual workshop over the summer to get feedback on the draft plan. Nick discussed different options for engaging the public and gathering feedback. This included a MetroQuest Survey, a virtual Zoom/Facebook live workshop, options for zoom “breakout” rooms. He was asking for feedback from the group. Rachael Bronson mentioned success using the breakout rooms for her projects.

It was discussed about getting the word out and the committee discussed in-person options such as dropping cards/info off at libraries and public places but that was identified as a logistical challenge. Using the existing MailChimp list of members and sending email blasts seemed applicable in addition to putting on MPO social media and the website.

Project Updates/Q&A - Nick gave an brief update on the VMT numbers from the region and House Bill 77 which lowered the cash floor. Discussion took place around how this could affect projects in the region. Ted Figura gave an update from the I-26 aesthetics committee.
