

Amendments to the 2024-2033 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)



## What is the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)?

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is our region's document that reflects planned transportation investments over a ten-year period. The TIP describes each project, a schedule for implementation, funding sources, and estimated costs. Current items are for modification of existing projects.

#### **Modifications Summary**

Amendments to the TIP this month are all the amendments that have been held on to while the new TIP and STIP were going through the process of being adopted by the MPO and

Board of Transportation, respectively. Of note, there have been a few project schedule delays to allow time for planning and/or right of way including the North RAD Greenway, Woodfin Greenway, and Riverwalk Greenway. This set of amendments also includes the addition of Nationally Significant Federal Lands and Tribal Projects funds to the Ecusta Trail, which were granted earlier this year. Additions to the TIP include several highway safety projects, as well as three rail safety projects, targeting crossings in Asheville, Black Mountain, and Canton. Deletions from the TIP include U-5973 (intersection improvements on Weaverville Hwy) and BL-0079 (the Texas Rd pedestrian bridge project in Montreat). Finally, this set of amendments reflects cost increases to I-2513AC, a section of the I-26 connector project that involves widening I-26/I-240 north of I-40 to Haywood Rd in Asheville.



#### P 7.0 Project Submittals

#### P 7.0 Submittals

#### What is P 7.0 and the Prioritization Process?

The Prioritization Process (aka SPOT) is the process that determines the majority of capital improvement projects funded through NCDOT and NCDOT's allotment of federal funds. The process is governed by the Strategic Transportation Investments (STI) Law of 2012 that provides the framework for a more data-driven and transparent process that also utilizes local input from NCDOT Divisions, MPOs, and RPOs. In relation to other aspects of transportation planning, the prioritization process serves as the bridge to determine what long-range needs are funded in the TIP/STIP for implementation.



P 7.0 refers to the seventh iteration of the prioritization process in North Carolina and will be the process that determines what new projects are funded in the 2026- 2035 TIP/STIP.

- Remove US 25 (Hendersonville Road) Access Management from Rock Hill Road to NC 146 (Long Shoals Road)
- Consolidate Two Projects on US 25 (Merrimon Avenue) to One Roadway Upgrade Project from I-240 to Wembley Drive
- Modify the US 70 (Tunnel Road) and US 74 Alt (South Tunnel Road) Project. Previous termini: Beaucatcher Tunnel to NC 81 (Swannanoa River Road.) Modified Termini: Beaucatcher Tunnel to US 74 Alt (South Tunnel Road.)
- Add Peachtree Road Extension to provide a connection between US 25 (Hendersonville Road) and US 25 Alt (Sweeten Creek Road) in a section where there is no connection for 2.2 miles
- Add NC 63 (New Leicester Highway) Intersection Improvements at Newfound Road, Ramsey Road, and Gouges Branch Road. Project initiated through public comment.
- Grade separation of Norfolk Southern Rail line at Blue Ridge Road. Request came in from NCDOT Rail Division.

## FHWA Updates – October 2023

#### Fiscal Year 2024 Appropriations Approved Through November 17, 2023

The President signed a <u>continuing resolution</u> on September 30, 2023 to approve Federal funding programs for Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 through November 17, 2023.

#### FHWA Announces \$9.6 Billion in Available Funding for the Bridge

**Investment Program** On September 27, 2023, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) published a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) to announce the availability of up to \$9.62 billion in funding for Large Bridge Project Grants through the Bridge Investment Program. Grants are available for bridges with total eligible project costs over \$100 million, with minimum grant awards of \$50 million, and maximum grant awards of 50 percent of the total eligible project costs. Here are the application deadlines:

- November 27, 2023, for consideration of funding from FY 2023 and FY 2024;
- August 1, 2024, for consideration of funding from FY 2025; and
- August 1, 2025, for consideration of funding from FY 2026.

## FHWA Announces \$100 Million in Available Funding for Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure

On September 13, 2023, FHWA <u>announced</u> the availability of \$100 million in funding through the Electric Vehicle Charger Reliability and Accessibility Accelerator Program to repair and replace existing, but non- operational, electric vehicle charging infrastructure. Eligible applicants for this program are limited to State Departments of Transportation (DOTs) and local governments. The application deadline is November 13, 2023. # **USDOT Announces Technical Assistance Opportunities for the Thriving Communities Program**

On September 12, 2023, the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) <u>announced</u> that the <u>Thriving Communities Program</u> is now accepting applications for FY 2023. Applicants interested in receiving technical assistance and peer learning support, have until November 15, 2023 to submit a Letter of Interest. Applicants interested in providing technical assistance, planning, and capacity building support, have until November 28, 2023 to submit an application. #### **EPA Starts 2-Year Conformity Grace Period for New MOVES4 Emissions Model**

On September 12, 2023, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) published a <u>notice</u> in the Federal Register to announce the availability of the latest Motor Vehicle Emission Simulator model major release (MOVES4) for official purposes outside of California. MOVES4 is the latest version of the EPA's state-of- the science modeling tool for estimating emissions from cars, trucks, buses, and motorcycles based on the latest data and regulations. This notice starts a two-year grace period (i.e., September 12, 2025) before MOVES4 will need to be used as the latest EPA emissions model for transportation conformity determinations outside of California, both in new regional emissions analyses and in new hot-spot analyses. ## **Census Bureau Publishes Technical Corrections for a Subset of Urban Areas from the 2020 Census**

On September 12, 2023, the Census Bureau published a <u>notice</u> in the Federal Register to make technical corrections to their previous <u>notice</u> published on December 29, 2022. For a small number of urban areas in California, Georgia, and Louisiana, the Census Bureau updated the population totals, housing counts, and land areas. FHWA and FTA will use these technical corrections to update the Transportation Management Area (TMA) designations published in the Federal Register on June 5, 2023. Stay tuned for more information.

#### FHWA Seeking Nominations for the 2024 Environmental Excellence Awards

On September 20, 2023, the FHWA Office of Planning, Environment, and Realty announced the opening of the <u>2024 Environmental Excellence Awards (EEA) Program</u>. The EEA Program recognizes outstanding transportation projects, processes, and partners that use FHWA funding sources to go above and beyond compliance to achieve environmental excellence. EEA nominations will be accepted through November 3, 2023. More information is available here.

## FHWA Seeking Public Comments on Intention to Collect Information from States and MPOs

On August 31, 2023, the FHWA Office of Planning, Environment, and Realty published a notice in the Federal Register to request public comments on the agency's intention to collect information from State DOTs and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) regarding planning and research work programs, periodic progress reports, and periodic financial reports, as part of 23 CFR Part 420 and 2 CFR Part 200. On September 6, 2023, FHWA published a notice in the Federal Register to extend the public comment period until November 6, 2023. FHWA will summarize and/or include public comments in its information collection approval request to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB).
